Comparative adjectives are usually introduced at elementary level after students have learnt a number of base adjectives. Superlative adjectives often follow in quick succession. Meaning. As their name suggests, comparative adjectives are used to make comparisons between two things.

Teaching Comparative Adjectives for comparing things to ...
Use of Comparative Adjectives. We use comparative adjectives when talking about 2 things (not 3 or 10 or 1,000,000 things, only 2 things). Often, the comparative adjective is followed by "than". Look at these examples: John is 1m80. He is tall. But Chris is 1m85. He is taller than John. America is big. But Russia is bigger.
