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organizational structure, policies and procedures, and compliance with state and federal laws.

Your organization must meet the eligibility criteria to obtain the accreditation. The standards are a roadmap for improvement—organizations can use the standards to perform a gap analysis and align their improvement activities in the areas that are

individuals, payers and  
states.

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Varies based upon how prepared the organization is in terms of policies and procedures/processes  
4-6 months 9-12 months for a new survey and 6-9 months for re-accreditation  
Generally 9-16 months from the point a decision is made about accreditation

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## Accreditation Organizations - Side Survey Scoring Guidelines

Ethics committees are required in hospitals and long-term care facilities accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO), but many LTCFs do not have JCAHO accreditation. A survey of LTCFs in one county in a Southwestern state found that only 29% of those LTCFs

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responding had an  
organized ethics  
committee.

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
