As physicians, we suspected that the “burnout” of individual clinicians, though real and epidemic, was actually a symptom of some deeper structural dysfunction in the health care system.

Moral injury and burnout in medicine: a year of lessons ...

In the Medscape survey, the highest percentage of physician burnout occurred among these medical specialties: Urology: 54%. Neurology: 50%. Nephrology: 49%. Diabetes and endocrinology: 46%. Family medicine: 46%. Radiology: 46%. The lowest rates of burnout were reported by physicians in these medical specialties: Public health and preventive medicine: 29%.

Physician burnout: Which medical specialties feel the most ...

Cross-sectional studies have consistently found physician specialty to be an independent predictor of burnout, with some specialties associated with 40 percent lower odds of burnout (e.g., dermatology) and others associated with up to 300 percent increased odds of burnout (e.g., emergency medicine, general internal medicine, neurology) in comparison with other specialties [1, 2, 27, 35, 55, 57, 58, 67], suggesting there is something unique to the work lives in these specialties that ...

Burnout Among Health Care Professionals: A Call to Explore ...

Substantial data 11,12 supports associations between burnout as measured using the MBI and health care related outcomes (e.g., medical error, 5,7, 8 malpractice, 13 suboptimal patient care practices, 14 physician turnover and early retirement, 15,16 and lower medical knowledge 17), suboptimal professionalism, 4,18 and personal outcomes (e.g., alcohol abuse 19-21 , suicidal ideation, 3, 6 and motor vehicle incidents 22) From a health system characteristics perspective, associations have been ...

Valid and Reliable Survey Instruments to Measure Burnout ...

Prevalence rates for professional burnout ranged from 7.0% to 75.2%, depending on country-specific factors, applied instruments, cutoff-criteria for burnout symptomatology. CONCLUSION: This review underlines the burden of burnout among medical students.

Professional burnout among medical students: Systematic ...

Both physicians and nurses had high levels of burnout (50.3% versus 52.0%, $P = 0.362$). Among countries or regions, burnout rates ranged from 34.6 to 61.5%.

Professional burnout among physicians and nurses in Asian ...

Burnout among healthcare providers is in relation to their gender, marital status, work environment, interpersonal and professional conflicts, emotional distress, and low social support. [4,17] Individual-focused, structural or organizational, or combine solutions were required. [11,18-21] Previous studies have already carried out systematic review on the physicians ' burnout. H

Interventions to reduce burnout of physicians and nurses ...

The problem of faculty burnout has led to calls by national organizations, such as the Blue Ridge Group, the AAMC and National Academy of Medicine, to address the well-being of faculty in academic medicine as a national priority and moral imperative. [See references 7-9.]

Reported risk factors for burnout in this population include working more than 48 hours per week, lack of appreciation on the part of the medical team or patients, fear of making a mistake, and working in internal medicine or the emergency department.
